

DECLARATIONMALTA RECOGNISES ESTONIA, LATVIA AND LITHUANIA AS
INDEPENDENT STATES

The Malta Government has been closely following the recent developments in the Soviet Union. The Government has already expressed its full satisfaction at the failure of last week's coup d'etat.

One of the developments was the clear and democratic choice by the Baltic Republics of Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania to be independent.

In view of all these developments the Malta Government declares that, with immediate effect, it recognises Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania as independent states.
